A graduate of Fordham University (M.A., Ph.D. in philosophy) and the Washington University School of Law, St. Louis (M.J.S.), he is the author of over 100 academic articles, book chapters, reference entries, and reviews.

Among his over one dozen books are *Defending Life* (Cambridge University Press, 2007), *Politics For Christians: Statecraft As Soulcraft* (IVP, 2010), (with R. P. George & S. McWilliams), *A Second Look at First Things: A Case For Conservative Politics* (St. Augustine's Press, 2013), *Taking Rites Seriously: Law, Politics, and the Reasonableness of Faith* (Cambridge University Press, 2015), winner of the American Academy of Religion's prestigious 2016 Book Award for Excellence in the Study of Religion in Constructive-Reflective Studies.

He has served as the 2008-2009 Mary Ann Remick Senior Visiting Fellow in the Center for Ethics & Culture at the University of Notre Dame as well as a 2002-2003 Visiting Research Fellow in the James Madison Program at Princeton University.

Robert Pasnau, professor of philosophy and director of the Center for Western Civilization, Thought and Policy, which houses the Conservative Thought and Policy Program, said Beckwith is a "distinguished philosopher and legal scholar who will broaden the intellectual conversation on the Boulder campus."

The Conservative Thought and Policy Program is supported by private funds.
