

Ambassador Sam H. Zakhem, an immigrant from Lebanon, became a US citizen in 1970. He registered as a Republican the same year and was immediately elected to be a precinct committeeman. He began his political career in 1974 when he was elected to the Colorado State House of Representatives, serving one term. In 1977, he served as the chair of the Finance Committee. Later, he served two terms in the Colorado State Senate. In 1986, he was appointed by President Ronald Reagan as Ambassador to Bahrain, a position he held until 1989 during the George H.W. Bush administration. Ambassador Zakhem was later heavily involved in building the Coalition of the Gulf War in 1990-1991.

Ambassador Zakhem is well-known for his stance against communism and his strong support of family, flag and country. He makes a special point of being a U.S. citizen "by choice," not by accident of birth.

In March, The Villager carried an article titled, "A Visit to Abu Dhabi." The Ambassador was a featured speaker at the 22nd Annual Conference in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates. The theme was The Future of the Region, Oil Price Challenges. The article stated that Zakhem gave a rousingly patriotic presentation, having been ambassador during the Desert Storm conflict, during which he helped the US Navy obtain key seaports in the area. He is fondly remembered and respected by the leaders in the Gulf states and was honored to be a panelist during the 2-day session.

Labor Day - September 4

Observed on the first Monday in September, Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day also symbolizes the end of summer for many Americans, and is celebrated with parties, parades and athletic events.

Labor Day, an annual celebration of workers and their achievements, originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters. In the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and sevenday weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages.

As manufacturing increasingly supplanted agriculture as the wellspring of American employment, labor unions, which had first appeared in the late 18th century, grew more prominent and vocal. They began organizing strikes and rallies to protest poor conditions and compel employers to renegotiate hours and pay. Many of these events turned violent during this period, including the infamous Haymarket Riot of 1886, in which several Chicago policemen and workers were killed.

Many credit Peter J. McGuire, cofounder of the American Federation of Labor, as the originator of the Labor Day holiday; others suggest that Matthew Maguire, a secretary of the Central Labor Union. Labor Day is still celebrated in cities and towns across the United States with parades, picnics, barbecues, fireworks displays and other public gatherings. For many Americans, particularly children and young adults, it represents the end of the summer and the start of the back-to-school season.






