Wayne Williams was elected Secretary of State of Colorado in 2014 with more votes than other secretary of state candidate in Colorado history. A Republican, he received the endorsement of the only two Democratic mayors in El Paso County because of the manner in which he conducted elections and other business while serving as El Paso County's clerk and recorder.

As Secretary of State, Williams is committed to the vision of ensuring fair, honest, and open elections as well as making Colorado the friendliest state in the country for businesses and non-profits.

In addition to his service in elected office and the community, he teaches employment law seminars throughout the nation.

Williams graduated with honors from Brigham Young University in 1986 and from the University of Virginia Law School in 1989. He was selected as a Harry S Truman Scholar.


