## March Speaker: Dick Wadhams

**Dick Wadhams** is a Colorado political consultant who served as Colorado Republican state chairman from 2007 to 2011. He serves as a political analyst for KCNC-TV/CBS4 in Denver. He worked for U.S. Senator Bill Armstrong from 1980 to 1989 in Colorado and Washington, D.C. and was campaign manager for U.S. Senator Hank Brown's campaign to succeed Armstrong in 1990. He also managed both of U.S. Senator Wayne Allard's campaigns in 1996 and 2002.

Wadhams was campaign manager for Colorado Governor Bill Owens in 1998 when Owens became the first Republican governor to be elected in 28 years and he remains the only Republican governor in the past 44 years. Wadhams served as press secretary for Governor Owens and he ran the successful statewide campaign to pass the governor's \$1.7 billion transportation improvement plan in 1999.

He was campaign manager for South Dakota U.S. Senator John Thune in 2004 when Thune unseated Senate Democratic Leader Tom Daschle which was the first time an incumbent Senate Leader was defeated for reelection in 52 years. He also worked for Montana U.S. Senator Conrad Burns in his successful campaigns in 1994 and 2000.

Dick Wadhams is a native of rural southeastern Colorado and is a graduate of Colorado State University-Pueblo.






