Daniel J. Steele has been a law enforcement officer for 22 years and is currently assigned to the 18th Judicial District Attorney's Special Victims Unit (SVU) as a Criminal Investigator. Steele is responsible for the investigation of human trafficking offenses in Arapahoe, Douglas, Elbert and Lincoln counties.

Steele was previously employed as a police officer with the U.S. Air Force and the Denver Police Department. While with Denver, in partnership with the FBI, founded the Rocky Mountain Innocence Lost Task Force. Steele supervised the unit for over five years. He is deputized through the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Innocence Lost national initiative as a Special Deputy United States Marshal to investigate crimes of human sex trafficking and the commercial sexual exploitation of children.

In 2014, Investigator Steele was selected by the Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police and then appointed by the governor to represent local law enforcement on the Colorado Human Trafficking Council. Steele was selected to co-chair the council's Legislative Task Force subcommittee in 2015, then co-chair the Training Task Force subcommittee in 2016.




